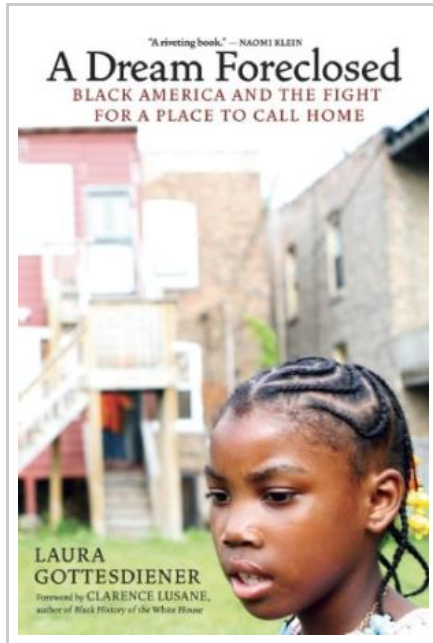



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A Dream Foreclosed: Black America and the Fight for a Place to Call Home (Paperback)
